Please find attached an updated version of the Digital Project Data Publication. Changes are summarised below:

- Acronym for Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development, Communications and the Arts has been corrected on pages 3 and 17.
- Questacon is listed under DISER in the "Agency" column.
- The description of the Energy Bill Relief Fund project has been updated to the following:

As part of the Energy Price Relief Plan, the Australian Government is partnering with states and territories to deliver targeted and temporary relief on power bills to eligible Australian households and small businesses that are customers of electricity retailers. Bill relief payments commenced on schedule from 1 July 2023.

Treasury is the policy owner and project lead. Services Australia was engaged in the project to provide Centrelink Confirmation eServices (CCeS), which is a secure online service for businesses to confirm a customer's entitlement to a concession, rebate or service. A temporary solution in CCeS was created for this measure with the plan to decommission this functionality in June 2024, to support formal project closure. This workflow relates solely to collecting customer consent on the electricity retailer/state/territory's behalf.

The DCA rating of "Medium" in December 2023 reflected the possibility, at that time, that decommissioning of the temporary CCeS workflow, and formal project closure, may occur after June 2024. The CCeS workflow decommissioning and project closure are currently on track for 30 June 2024 as planned. Retailers will still be able to use the CCeS system to confirm concession or payment entitlement for rebates after the workflow is closed. All other elements of this project have been delivered successfully and on schedule.
