Policy all non-corporate Commonwealth entities, except for the National Intelligence Community and Defence, will be required to:

- (a) designate responsibility for implementing the Policy to appropriate accountable officials. This responsibility includes notifying the DTA of new high-risk uses of AI in the relevant entity to support a consistent approach to risk mitigation.
- (b) publish an AI transparency statement.
- 4. Section 47C the Policy strongly recommends that each agency implement AI fundamentals training for all APS staff within 6 months of the Policy's effect date as well additional training as required taking into consideration staff roles and responsibilities. The DTA is developing an AI training module to support agencies.

6. In parallel to Secretaries Board's consideration of the Policy, the DTA has been working with stakeholders to develop guidance materials that support agencies with Policy implementation.

- 7. Through consultation on the guidance for AI transparency statements, we have determined that a consistent approach to the statements across government is required to strengthen public trust in government's use of AI.
- 8. To ensure consistency across government we are seeking your agreement to implement transparency requirements through a *Standard for AI transparency statements* Section 47C which will accompany the Policy.
- 9. To facilitate this, we have made a minor update to Policy wording following Secretaries Board's agreement. Section 34

Section 34

The revised text is as

follows: Agencies must make publicly available a statement outlining their approach to AI adoption and use within six months of this Policy taking effect, as directed by the DTA.

10. We are also seeking your agreement to proposed requirements for transparency statements. The proposed requirements, which may undergo minor revision prior to publication, can be found at <u>Attachment B</u>.

11. Pending your agreement and outcomes of consultation with the Minister for Industry and Science, the DTA seeks your agreement to publish the Policy in early August 2024 ahead of formal commencement of the Policy.

Commonwealth Artificial Intelligence Assurance Framework




Figure 1: Australian Government Al Assurance eco-system

13. The Framework guides Australian Government agencies through impact assessments of AI use cases against Australia's AI Ethics Principles and aligns to the recently agreed National framework for assurance of artificial intelligence in government (see Figure 1 below).

- 14. The AI in Government taskforce developed guidance to support use of the Framework in consultation with agencies across government. This consultation was also used as an opportunity to iterate and improve the Framework ahead of the pilot phase.
- 15. Draft versions of the Framework and Guidance are at <u>Attachments C and D</u>, noting that these were endorsed for pilot by the SES B2 AI Steering Committee on 31 July 2024.
- 16. To provide visibility and garner engagement with the Framework, we have drafted a letter to be sent to the Ministry seeking support for agency participation in the pilot (Attachment E).
- 17. Although the Framework is not mandated and is subject to change following the pilot, we recommend that it, along with the guidance, be published alongside the Policy. This approach is consistent with other AI initiatives including the *Interim guidance on the use of publicly available generative AI*, and the *National framework for the assurance of AI in government*.

19. To support implementation of the Policy and additional measures, Secretaries Board agreed to support a secondee contribution model. This approach will see the DTA continuing to absorb costs of leading the work and other agencies providing support through seconded staff at their cost.
